

Current Member 2023 – 2024 Spring Season

Howdy, Howdy, Hi!

I'm excited to get the second half of the rodeo season underway. Here's a little paperwork.

The following is a recap of details you need to know going into the Spring Season. Don't assume this is repeat information, there are some changes and good reminders.

Membership Portal: All forms will need to be uploaded to your portal page. Scanning documents is preferred. If you take a picture with your phone, please <u>tape the document to an upright surface</u> (wall or refrigerator). Taking a picture on the counter is not acceptable. When you visit your portal page <u>make sure all of your personal information is correct</u>, check for typos and/or spelling errors please. Let me know if you've forgotten your username, as I can help you log in. There are detailed log-in instructions on the Membership page.

Website: The **ndhsra.org** site is where all details are posted. If you see something that needs to be updated, do not hesitate to let me know.

- Online Rodeo Entries: Go to the "Enter Rodeo's" page where you will find the
 instructions, a printable schedule of the specific dates, when entries open for each
 rodeo, and the link to the online entry system. All entry fees are due and payable
 the morning of the rodeo.
- Rodeo Schedule Page: Remember to click on the rodeo name and print off the
 detail sheet. Some rodeos don't follow the "usual" event order. It's up to you to read
 this information as it provides everything you'll need to know about that rodeo. Stall
 reservation forms will also be attached to this page for those committee's offering
 stalls.

Jackpotting your Events:

- Everyone who jackpots is required to complete a W-9 form. There is one attached to the Membership page. This must be loaded in your portal. Jackpot checks will not be mailed if there is not a W-9 available. We will not call for the information.
- Jackpot entry fee is \$10 per event due and payable at each rodeo. Payout breakdown is determined by the number jackpotting in each event. Payout checks will be handed out at the end of the Spring season only if a W-9 is on file.
- Anyone earning \$600 or more will receive a 1099-Misc tax form the following January.

The NDHSRA Board of Directors will continue to enforce the following policies:

Entry Fees: Are to be paid the day of the rodeo, directly to the rodeo committee, prior to competing in your events. If these fees aren't paid prior to competing, you will be **fined \$50**. No excuses will be accepted. If you travel to the rodeos separate from your parents, then you need to plan to have a check or cash on-hand to pay your entry fees. The only exception is when we have the cow cutting event the night before the rodeo. Cutters, all your entry fees will be due and payable prior to competing in the rodeo. This \$50 fine needs to be paid in full before you can compete in the next rodeo.

Draw Outs (Rodeo and Jackpot): Once you've entered a rodeo and learn you can't make it, you have an opportunity to draw out without any penalties. The draw out deadline is at **5:00pm CST the Monday before the rodeo**. **You can draw out by texting the state**

secretary, but **e-mails are preferred**. Look for a response confirming your draw out. If you don't receive confirmation, the secretary may not have received your message. If you miss the deadline, you'll be responsible to pay your entry fees from the missed rodeo before you can compete in the next rodeo. The only exception to this deadline is if you have a doctor or a vet release which needs to be turned in prior to the next rodeo.

Turn Outs: For one reason, or another, contestants have paid their entry fees, but don't show up to compete. We understand things can change, even during a rodeo, but when you don't show up it delays the rodeo. If you decide to Turn Out of an event and do not notify the High School Rodeo Secretary, you will be fined \$10 per event. To be paid prior to your next rodeo.

Rodeo Draw: The draw will be posted on the website by Tuesday morning prior to the rodeo. It's your responsibility to check the draw that day and notify the secretary immediately of any discrepancies.

Late Entries: A late fee of \$50.00 will be assessed to a contestant who missed the entry deadline (11:59pm CST) but contacts the secretary by 5:00pm CST on Monday prior to the draw out deadline. After this, there will be no late entries except due to secretary error to include a one-time grace period for a missed deadline for a new membership.

Rule Book: The National Rule Book is posted on the bottom of the website page. You can print an enlarged version from the website. There are always rulebooks at the rodeos.

Back Numbers: You'll get a new back number when you pay your entry fees at your first spring rodeo. Hang on to this number as you'll need to wear it at every rodeo. If you'd like, you can laminate your number to help preserve it for the entire spring season. You will have the same back number throughout your high school rodeo career.

Fundraising: All the fundraising details and advertising forms are on the website.

Rifle and Trap Shoot Contest: All rifle and trap shoots contestants will enter online. All deadlines apply. Remember, the top four at State will qualify to compete at the National High School Rodeo Finals in Rock Springs, Wy.

Queen Contest: This is open to any young lady who is a member of the NDHSRA and in the 9th, 10th or 11th grade. The competition is held each year during the State Finals in Bowman. If you're interested, contact Codi Miller for further details at 701-440-8392 or at codimiller@live.com.

Adopt-A-Rodeo: We continue to need your help with this program. It was created for the rodeo committees who have stepped up to host a rodeo but need help the day of the rodeo. We're asking those of you (**parents** and **contestants**) who aren't assisting with another rodeo to volunteer at one of the fall or spring rodeos. It could be running a gate, setting up barrels or poles, picking up hats or working in the concession stand. Please help do your part to assist these committees. They're hosting these rodeos for our children. **Please mark the rodeo you would like to assist on the Spring 2024 Membership Form found under the Membership Forms tab of the NDHSRA website.**

You cannot compete until all forms are submitted correctly three weeks prior to your first Spring rodeo.

 Member Management Portal and update your personal information. Be sure that all your parents' information is up to date. <i>Please check your spelling and typing</i> .
 Certificate of Eligibility Signed by School Officials. This is to be uploaded in your NHSRA Member Management Portal.
 Submit your current grade transcripts. To be uploaded in your NHSRA Member Management Portal.
Upload a completed W-9 form if you plan to jackpot. This must be in your portal, or you will not receive your jackpot check. We will not call you for this information.
 Enter/Update your bio information in the NHSRA Member Management Portal.
Be sure to review the Online Entry System Instructions. It's important that you note when the rodeo entries open.

CERTIFICATE OF ELIGIBILITY

2024 Spring Season

The NHSRA Qualifications:

- Students must be in good standing; not ruled undesirable for misconduct at school.
- Students must be under 20 years of age at the first of the National High School Rodeo year (August 1st) and are or have been enrolled in the 9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade the year just preceding the National Rodeo the contestant is entering.
- Must have <u>passing grades in at least 70% of the classes taken</u>. (For example: If you are taking 10 classes in a quarter/semester, you have to be passing 7 of them.)
- Students must also be eligible with their school concerning any tobacco, alcohol, etc., violations are the right of your school to enforce.
