



Code of Conduct

Updated July 2024

Any member may be disqualified from an NDHSRA or NHSRA event/rodeo for any of the following offenses:

- Having any association with alcoholic beverages, narcotic, tobacco products or other non-medicinal drugs while in attendance at any approved High School or Junior High Rodeo or sanctioned activity. Whether at a motel, on rodeo grounds, or going to or from the rodeo or at any NHSRA function. The member will be suspended from further rodeo activity for six weeks. If they are disqualified for any of these offenses, they will be disqualified from all events or other participation in the rodeo, NHSRA event, or other function.
- Rowdyism, quarreling or fighting in the actual domain of the arena at any time, or any place during the duration of the Rodeo.
- Conduct or speech of any kind detrimental to the best interests of the NHSRA, NDHSRA, or the sport of rodeo while in attendance, or coming to and going home from a rodeo.
- Motel or property damage by contestants or their associates; damage must be reported to the NDHSRA President and/or National Director. If damage is not reported, contestants will be banned from the High School Rodeo Association permanently and reported to law authorities for prosecution.
- Contestants will be disqualified for vandalism at any place or any time.
- Cheating or attempting to cheat.
- Any contestants or parents attempting to fix, threaten, bribe, influence, harass or coerce any rodeo official at any time.
- Missing any mandatory meeting, safety seminar, or equipment check.
